Application **Deadline September 23**

- Grant Portal is at <https://grants.ntia.gov>
- Portal opened August 14
- Requires SAM.gov account and UEI to access portal

Data and Reporting Requirements

- Annual reports
- Evaluation report (annually)
- Financial reports (2x year)
- Performance (technical) report (June 30 each year)

Competitive Grant Highlights

Grant Expectations

- \$5M - \$12M each
- 90% project cost with 10% matching funds (cash or in-kind)
- 10% cap for administrative costs
- \$750m available this rounds. \$250m available in additional rounds (TBD).

Priorities

- Partnerships of entities with ability to administer significant resources
- Reach covered populations
- Greatest impact potential
- Outcomes: measurable, achievable, sustainable, and timely

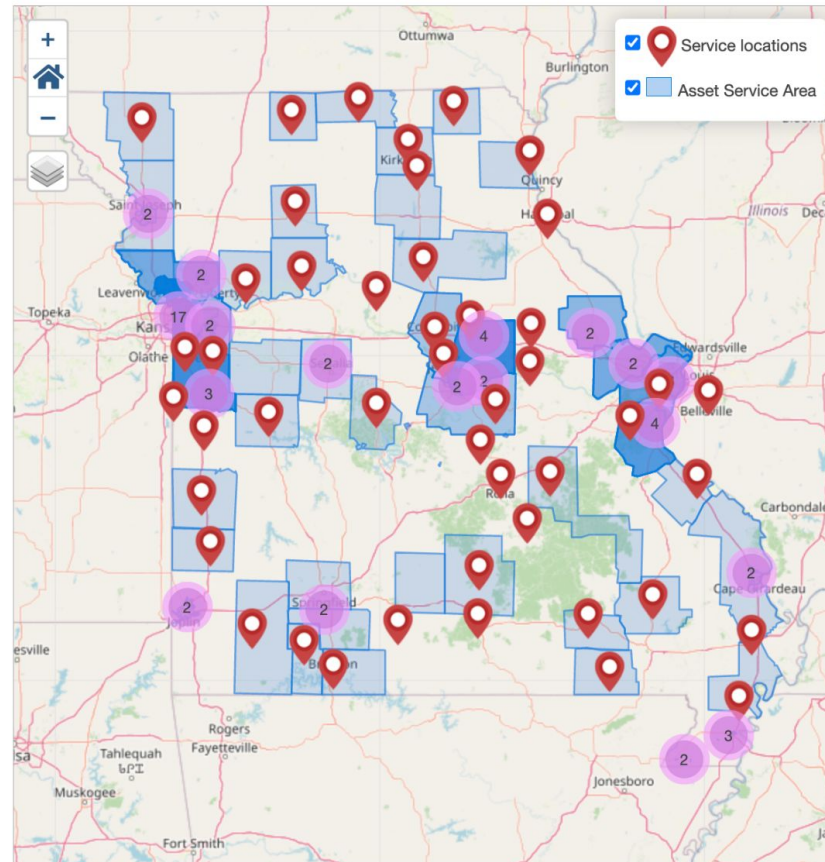
