- Will not be able to answer every question clearly due to short timeframe on this revised process but will answer what they can
- Need providers/applicants to make application as want to get as many service locations covered
 - 75% locations were to be covered in round 1 and want to do it again
 - Opened application period 7/10/25 through 7/24 at 5:00 pm
 - Stayed with the same service location areas
 - OBD will review applications immediately after 7/24
 - After review another "lightning round" will occur for remaining unserved areas but will be based on location to location
 - Late August 7 day public comment period
 - Sept 4 final proposal due to NTIA



- Q+A
 - What is NTIA telling you?
 - Don't ask for an extension now. Work the process, try to meet the current timelines and then if need more time, end request with justification.
 - Have you seen any impact on providers that previously applied? Any drop out?
 - The application period just opened so too early to tell.
 Application process has been simplified.
 - Were any locations removed from eligibility due to being already served by Fixed Wireless
 - No a few were reported as served and third party reviewed. They did not meet speed and/or scalability requirements (determined on project basis)



- Q&A (cont)
 - Does high- cost areas have to have the 25% match?
 - No
 - Some providers were to provide service by 12?
 - No OBD has requested waiver to add 700/800 locations that did not get served so they will become eligible locations now (included on maps). Waiting on NTIA approval.
 - A provider stated they had over \$100,000 invested in first application and now have to do again. Hardship on providers.
 - BJ indicated that he understood but hoped some could be reimbursed as an eligible expense if award granted



- Q&A (cont)
 - Providers can take out up to 20% of the locations from the area.
 Concern about getting these areas served.
 - These locations can be bid on during the "lightning round".

BJ indicated that the application guide would be posted to the website this afternoon.
