

BEAD Non-Deployment Overview

Every state will have BEAD funds remaining after completing rural broadband deployment. By law, these remaining funds may be used for a wide range of “non-deployment” activities, such as:

- Broadband adoption programs
- Permitting and pole attachments
- Mapping and data collection
- Telehealth and education programs
- Workforce development
- Middle mile and cellular infrastructure
- Apartment building wiring and Wi-Fi
- Affordability programs

The “non-deployment” categories were created by Congress to maximize the positive impact of BEAD networks. However, earlier this year, NTIA cancelled all non-deployment activities and now appears poised to claw back non-deployment funds or limit their uses.

The table below shows how much non-deployment funding is available to each state as of January 2026.
