

BEAD Non-Deployment Overview

After making awards to ISPs, states may use their remaining BEAD funds (see Table 1) for a variety of purposes as determined by law and NTIA. These remaining funds are referred to as “*non-deployment funds*,” although they potentially may be used for infrastructure deployment.

Statutory Uses of BEAD “Non-Deployment” Funds per 47 USC § 1702(f)

- Broadband mapping and data collection
- Improving internet service quality and affordability in multi-family residential buildings
- Supporting broadband adoption, including by providing devices and laptops
- Any use deemed necessary by NTIA, which, while not specified in law, could include:
 - Improving permitting processes
 - Enhancing public safety communication systems, like Next Gen 911
 - Connecting locations missed by BEAD or other infrastructure programs
 - Workforce development
